The ideal candidate would be expected to be a consultant with a track record in academia, including publishing, grants, research conduct and delivery, as well as leadership experience in either academia or clinical care. A higher degree is desirable.

Application process:


- Applicants should send a one-page cover letter, highlighting why the candidate meets the criteria and what they hope to bring to DAS, and a two-page CV.
- The cover letter and CVs will be reviewed by the DAS Executive Committee and current Scientific Officer.
- Candidates might be required to attend an interview.
- Applications close on 27 July 2026 at 08:00.

- Results will be announced by before November, and the candidate will be confirmed at the DAS ASM in Wales.

In line with other non-executive posts in DAS, the tenure of DAS Scientific Officer will be for an initial 2-year period from DAS ASM, which is extendable.
